### A Message from Laura

This is a month of celebration, with the month of June book ended by the Jubilee celebrations and Happy Days. In between, we have two weddings in church as well. A time for celebration and I would like to



reflect on the Queen and her 70 years on the throne.

I wonder if the job of Queen was advertised if our current queen would have gone for it? Or would she have preferred something quieter, maybe working with horses? We don't always get to choose our roles and we have to fulfil them as best we can. The Queen was thrown into her role suddenly, in her mid-twenties and a young woman in the highest office in the early 1950s, when Winston Churchill was still Prime Minister. You can imagine how daunting this new adventure was for her. 70 years later, the Queen's friend and cousin, Margaret Rhodes, was asked if she thought the Queen would ever abdicate. She replied, "Oh no. Through age, there is no possible danger of her abdicating... she feels.. .the vows she made on her coronation are ones she wants to fulfil to the nth degree." The Queen's sense of her own vocation and sustaining duty is palpable and admirable. She has woven this thread of her life very closely with her faith. She has spoken more about this faith in recent years. In 2014, in her Christmas broadcast, she said that Jesus Christ is an inspiration and an anchor in her life. Through faith we may find this steadfastness, this anchor in whatever situations we find ourselves.

The Queen describes Jesus as the anchor of her life and the light to her path. Our vocations may not be as clear-cut as the

Queen's, but we all have vocations, the things that bring us energy, that give us life. What might yours be? We may all have stages or moments in life when we have a choice between maintaining the status quo, or jumping bravely into something new, regardless of our age and stage. These choices must be taken thoughtfully and prayerfully.

The Queen often quotes a poem by Minnie Louise Haskins, quoted by her father, King George VI in his Christmas Day broadcast in 1939, just after the country had gone to war for the second time in a quarter of a century:

I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year, 'Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown.' And he replied,

'Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the hand of

That shall be to you better than a light and safer than a known way.'

Following our vocation may require us to make bold, new decisions. Or it may require us to remain steadfast on our path. Irenaeus tells us that the glory of God is a human being fully alive. Reflecting God's glory means being who we are and flourishing - as Margaret Rhodes would say - to the nth degree. Enjoy all the celebrations ahead.
